

With the pollen season approaching, and with the impact of the thunderstorm asthma event in Melbourne last November in mind, We must be prepared for the upcoming Asthma season.

Thunderstorm Asthma: The devastating thunderstorm asthma event in Melbourne during last year's pollen season highlighted the risk for people with underlying breathing conditions. People with asthma and hay fever were particularly vulnerable. Asthma Australia has worked closely with the authorities in Victoria and now provides a thunderstorm asthma module in their online training so school staff can be prepared for such an event should it occur in school time. You can help by ensuring your child's Asthma Plan is up to date and the school has an in-date blue reliever puffer and spacer for them in case of an emergency.

Asthma Kids: Looking for a way to help your child understand more about their asthma or about a friend with asthma?
