Easy Banana Bread

RECIPE

3 ripe bananas, mashed
1 cup white sugar
¼ cup melted butter
1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt

- Preheat oven to 165 degrees Celsius. We prepared a muffin tray and applied grease (melted butter)
- Combine mashed bananas, sugar, egg and butter together in a bowl. Mix flour and baking soda in a separate bowl. Stir into banana mixture until batter is just mixed. Stir salt into batter. Pour batter into the prepared baking tray.
- Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted in the center of the bread comes out clean, about 1 hour.
