

Come 'n try fishing event in Manor Lakes-Wyndham

Werribee River Association is hosting a community day and fishing event at Manor Lakes Reserve on Saturday 8th October, 10am-2pm.

The Catch a Carp Day will provide opportunities for people with little or no fishing experience to come and try fishing. Equipment, bait, advice and the recreational fishing license to participate are all included in the event.

Keen anglers are encouraged to attend, as we will be looking to reduce the population of carp.

Carp are a noxious, introduced pest in our waterways and can impact our native aquatic species. By removing this fish from our lakes and rivers, we can create better habitat for our wildlife whilst being active outdoors in nature.

One of the highlights of the day will be fishing expert and champion angler, Jo Starling attending. Jo and her husband Starlo have an online fishing community - Fishotopia, are described as Australian's best loved fishing couple, and have many fishing accolades under their belt.

Jo will be running small-group classes, providing tuition on bait, casting, how to identify fish habitats, best fishing spots and much, much more. Jo is passionate about opening the sport of angling up to newcomers, particularly women and children.

For those not as keen on fishing, the Catch A Carp Day will include refreshments, live music, and nature walks.
