What are the class sizes?

Every new Prep child is partnered up with a Grade 6 student and spends learning time together every fortnight. The big buddies keep a watch out for their prep buddies, especially at recess and lunchtimes to make sure that they are OK. This makes the preps feel more secure and happier at school and it develops the older children's awareness of the younger ones.

How do you address bullying?
