



Fantastic Learning Happening at St Theresa's


Year 5/6 : This term the 5/6s investigated food production and food safety. The students looked at the process that food production undergoes and the safety, health and hygiene practices that are essential in food handling. They then planned and prepared a meal that utilized the food handling skills they had learnt. In Art used a variety of modelling tools and skilled techniques to create a 3D sculpture of nutritional foods that they prepared.



Year 3/4 : The 3/4 students explored the ways that the Earth's surface is impacted upon by human activity and natural processes to understand how and why the earth is changing in our local area as well as nationally and globally. They had the opportunity to choose their own topic for a group investigation.



PREP : The Preps explored light and sound and how it is received by our bodies. They also discovered how light and sound affect everyone and where it is found in the world. They used a design brief to experiment with investigating, designing, producing and evaluating a dream catcher.



Year 1/2 : 1/2s investigated "How is light and sound produced?" and "How does our body process light and sound?" The students learnt that the eye and ear are unique in their makeup. They developed an understanding that sound is produced by tiny, rapid vibrations and produced these fantastic musical instruments.
