2/3K : **Sunny** for her great imagination when creating her spooky character. **Ethan** for always trying his hardest even when work is a challenge.

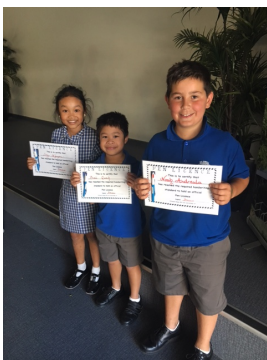
2/3P : **Prioshka** for being a responsible, reliable and dedicated student. **Christian** for being honest with himself and setting achievable learning goals
