## Year 1/2 Term 4 Overview 2019

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Literacy In reading the children will be exposed to a variety of information texts about nocturnal animals. They will develop skills in researching and summarising. They will continue to develop their reading skills and develop strategies to assist their comprehension. The children will compose persuasive texts in order to persuade a reader to take on a particular point of view.	Mathematics In Mathematics the students will continue to develop their skills in representing ordering and modelling numbers into the 1000. They will recognise, describe and interpret fractions in their environment. Using the language of probability they will describe the chance of events occuring.		
<b>Inquiry</b> When answering the question "How does the movement of the earth around the sun affect living things?" and "What happens at night?" The students will learn that life on earth involves cycles of change. They will discover that the cycle of day and night is one of these cycles. The will understand that all living things are affected by night and day. They will explore nocturnal animals and discover the special features they have which help them to survive. Through these discoveries they will understand that humans have a responsibility to care for the environment; which is called this stewardship.	Religion The students will be exposed to the story of the good Samaritar they will learn that christians are challenged to respect and care for their neighbours. They will learn that God created the world out of love and kindness for humans. They will know that Christians are called to be stewards of creation. They will know that Mary was a disciple of God as she trusted in God's call for her to become Jesus Christ's Mother. They will develop an understanding that Advent is a time for waiting, hoping and preparation for the birth of Jesus Christ. Christmas - Level 1 Mary trusted in God's call for her to become Jesus Christ Mother. Celebration is an important part of life that involves offering gifts, giving thanks and using symbols. Level 2 Mary said yes to God's invitation to be the mother of Jesus Christ. Advent is a time for waiting, hoping and preparation for the birth of Jesus Christ.

<b>Performing Arts</b> This Term in Performing Arts students will be exploring the elements of dance by practising fundamental movements to follow organised choreography. They will practise using musical cues to create dance sequences and further develop expressive skills to improve stage performance.	Art The elements of line, shape and texture will be explored with a focus on colour and why and where colors are positioned on a colour wheel e.g. secondary colours in between primary colours. Children will explore how indigenous author/artist Bronwyn Bancroft uses the elements of art in her unique and colourful illustrations.
